Howard R. Winokuer, Ph.D., LPC, NCC, brings passion and years of experience to his work with grief and bereavement. During his 20 year career, he has helped heal and educate thousands of people. He has conducted workshops and seminars throughout the United States, as well as in seven foreign countries. Dr. Winokuer has written numerous articles on grief, bereavement and death. His new book, *Grief and Bereavement in Contemporary Society: Bridging Research and Practice* is due out in 2011.

Dr. Winokuer founded the Winokuer Center in Charlotte, North Carolina, in 2001, where his private practice still flourishes today. Prior to that, he was the co-founder of TO LIFE, a not-for-profit educational and counseling organization that specialized in issues dealing with grief and loss. He has also been an adjunct faculty member for 6 colleges in the North Carolina and Mississippi areas. Dr. Winokuer is immediate past president of the Association for Death Education and Counseling (ADEC)
